6th Annual “A Walk in Their Boots”, a FREE Military Timeline Event in Johnson City Tennessee to attract local Veterans, Living Historians and the Public to Tipton Haynes State Historic Site

Johnson City, TN 11/1/2017 – If you would like to take a look back in time over the military history of the United States then the Tipton Haynes State Historic Site is the place to be this pre-Veteran’s Day weekend. From 10AM to 4PM, Saturday and Sunday, November 4th and 5th, living historians will be on site to showcase our armed forces spanning from the American Revolution to current day. The event, now in its 6th year, is a FREE event that collectively honors American Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen and Marines which have served our great country.

The event will feature encampments and reenactors displaying artifacts and equipment while portraying life on the frontier during the Revolution, the Barbary Coast Wars, the American Civil War, World War One, World War Two, Korea, Vietnam, Desert Shield and Storm and the more recent conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan. Living history displays and presentations will take place throughout the morning. Battle reenactments of the Vietnam War (1:15PM), the Civil War (2:15PM) and World War Two (3:15PM) will take place in the afternoon.

Veterans are encouraged to attend what will be the second annual Veteran Salute and Luncheon (Saturday), to enjoy the presentations from reenactors and to share their own personal stories of service with fellow veterans and the public. At the 2016 event, over 80 veterans spanning from WWII to current day attended where six honored veterans shared their personal stories of military life to a very appreciative audience.

This FREE to the public event was developed to educate ALL regarding the hardships of military life, equipment that the soldiers used, uniforms they wore, and battlefield tactics deployed throughout our country’s history. The event is open to the public with FREE parking and admission.
